## THE PASTOR'S PAGE

#### February / March 2022



"And a voice came out of the cloud, saying, "This is my Son, whom I have chosen. Listen to him!"" Luke 9:35 (CJB)

These words of God from the story of the Transfiguration mark the end of the Epiphany season. Three days after we hear these words, we will begin our annual Lenten journey. But before we commence that journey, it would do us well to dwell on these words from God and contemplate their

meaning for us. If you will recall, the Transfiguration is the manifestation of Jesus' glory to His apostles, Peter, James and John.

The season of Epiphany is bookended with the Baptism of Jesus and the Transfiguration. The words that God uses here at the Transfiguration were the same as at Jesus' baptism with the added admonition to the apostles to "listen to him." It is interesting to note that at the beginning, when God created, God spoke and the 'universe' listened to God and came into being. It is here, where God tells the apostles to 'listen' to the Word of God, Jesus, where the new creation begins to come into being. For it is after this, that Jesus begins His journey to Jerusalem to fulfill His mission from God. I am not saying that the 'new creation' began at the Transfiguration, but it started to become more in focus at this point. It could be argued that the actual start of this new creation began at Jesus' birth or even at Jesus' baptism where God used the same words to 'introduce' Jesus to the world.


So, what does it mean to "Listen to Him."? We not only listen with our ears, but also with our other senses. We can hear the words with which Jesus teaches, admonishes, encourages, pushes, and reveals to us about God. We can also 'hear' the way that Jesus acts and what He does and match those actions with what we know about God and attribute to God alone and accept that Jesus does those same things. We can 'hear' Jesus as He interacts with others through love and compassion, seeing those who He meets as a child of God and doing what He can to help them in their struggles without seeing what is in it for Himself. We can 'hear' Jesus as He fulfills the Messianic prophecies from the Old Testament. Throughout the season of Epiphany, we have listened to readings that reveals God to us through Jesus. We see that Jesus is the fulfillment of the Scriptures and can do those things that only God can do. We have also listened to some of the resistance towards Jesus, the questioning of His ability to do those things that He has done. These readings have presented the same thing with which we face ourselves, that is, how do we know that Jesus is for real, that He is the One who should be followed? This question can also take us to the question of whether God exists or not. What it comes down to is what do we believe in, what do we trust to be true?

Believing in God and Jesus ultimately comes down to a matter of faith, of trust. While we cannot really 'prove' that God is and that Jesus is God's Son who came to redeem the world, we can point to history and see those times when God has intersected with our lives in a more direct way than at other times.

Using this faith, this trust as the starting point and seeing the season of Epiphany as the revealing of God through Jesus; we can prepare ourselves for the next season of the church year, the season of Lent. Beginning on March 2 with Ash Wednesday, we will begin this annual journey to Christ's cross and the empty grave. But first, we need to have a basis from which we can accept Jesus' bold, redeeming act for us.

There is a saying, "Ah, the tales that could be told if only these walls could talk." This Lent, we will hear some of those stories that could be told if inanimate objects could talk. We will hear what some of the items that are a part of the Passion of Jesus would say if they could talk. Please join us on the Wednesdays in Lent to hear these tales and the impact that encountering Jesus had on these objects.

# FROM PENNY'S KITCHEN

### **Bacon Cheddar Muffins**

2 cups Bisquick 2/3 cup milk 1/4 cup vegetable oil 1 egg 1 cup (4 ounces) finely shredded sharp cheddar cheese 8 bacon strips, cooked and crumbles

In a bowl, combine the biscuit mix, milk, oil and egg just until moistened. Fold in cheese and bacon. Fill greased muffin cups (or use paper muffin cups in muffin pan) three-fourths (3/4) full.

Bake at 375 degrees for 20 minutes or until golden brown. Cool for 10 minutes; remove from pan to wire rack. Refrigerate leftovers. Yields about a dozen muffins.

#### Banana Bread

| Cream:    | 3/4 cup butter or margarine                 |
|-----------|---|
| Add:      | 1 1/2 cup white sugar gradually             |
| Blend in: | 1 1/2 cup mashed ripe bananas (4-6 bananas) |
|           | 2 eggs                                      |
|           | 1 tsp vanilla                               |
| Sift:     | 2 cups flour                                |
|           | 1 tsp baking soda                           |
|           | 1 tsp salt                                  |
|           |   |

Add sifted dry ingredients alternately with 1/2 cup buttermilk or 1/2 cup \*sour milk blending just until well combined. Fold in 1/2 cup chopped walnuts if desired. Pour into greased loaf pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 1 1/2 hours.

\*To sour sweet milk, add 2 tsp of vinegar.
