#### The Pastor's Page

## October / November 2022



The fields have been changing for a few weeks now, turning from that green of summer to browns, signifying that harvest is soon near. We are settling back into our schedules of school, work and all the other activities that restart after Labor Day. The national 'religion' of football has resumed its normal schedule of games and pre- and post- game shows, analysis of the games played the previous week and previews of the games coming up. A pastor once commented that at their new congregation, they were told that they could preach as long as they wanted to, but be aware people would

leave to get home in time for opening kickoff of the Vikings' game. What is disturbing now is there are many shows which revolve around the betting odds and how one can place a bet on the game. Not only are there odds on the final score in the game, but you could probably find odds on most any kind of statistic that the game records.

This got me to thinking, what if the church and its congregations ran a similar format as pro football? I'm not sure what it would look like, but maybe something like this; services that are recorded and streamed or broadcast later would have play-by-play announcers and color commentators, explaining what is going on in the service, maybe why the hymns were selected, what each part of the liturgy signified, or in the case of a non-liturgical congregation, why they chose the worship format that they did. There could be commentary on the sermon content, pausing the sermon to emphasize a point the pastor made or even neglected to make, how well the sermon fits with the core beliefs of the particular denomination. There could also be commentary on how well the congregation sings and knows the hymns, the participation of the congregation in the service and how much people put into the offering plates. The work of the ushers would be graded out and the color analyst would point out how they could improve their ushering skills. There would be interviews of those in attendance who would give their overall opinion of the service with particular emphasis on the delivery of the sermon, how well the readings were read. I'm sure there could be some sort of scoring system put in place to score the service and then compare it to other congregations of the same denomination and between denominations. There could be competitions set up between denominations where the best preachers and liturgists would go up against each other and 'win' for their denomination. While this is pure fantasy and would never become a reality, it does point out the difference between something that is temporary (football) versus something that is permanent (our salvation).

Why is it that people show more loyalty to something like a sports team that only looks to have you spend money on their product than they do for their church? Why do people who disagree with each other find unity around a sports team? In a society that is polarized to the degree that it is, it seems the only thing that unifies people is the local favorite sports teams. Granted between team fans there can be a bit of polarization, but they all are still fans of the game. Why is there so much polarization within our churches that it seems like the only way to solve our differences is to split? What happened to the belief that Jesus died for our sins and that it is through His death and resurrection that we are given the promise of eternal life with God as a child of God?

This being October, we need to be reminded of Martin Luther's hope that the church of his day returns to being focused on Jesus and the Gospel. We need to focus that our God is a God of love and because of this love, reconciliation of broken relationships. Unlike fans of a sports team, however, we are called to participate in that repairing of relationships and work towards the goal that God has. We need to learn how to talk with our neighbors about that which unites us and not what divides us. Perhaps in doing this, we overcome those forces that want to polarize us and we will see that we have more in common than we are led to believe.



# **Recipes From Penny's Kitchen**

# **Rosemary Baked Chicken with Potatoes**

#### **Ingredients**

- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 tablespoon Paprika
- 1 1/2 teaspoons Whole Rosemary Leaves
- 1 teaspoon Sea Salt Grinder
- 1/2 teaspoon Coarse Ground Black Pepper
- 1/2 teaspoon Garlic Powder
- 6 bone-in chicken thighs, skin removed (about 2 pounds)
- 1 1/2 pounds small red potatoes, halved

#### Instructions

Preheat oven to 425°F. Mix oil, paprika, rosemary, sea salt, pepper and garlic powder in large bowl. Add chicken and potatoes; toss to coat well. Arrange chicken and potatoes in single layer on foil-lined 15x10x1-inch baking pan sprayed with no stick cooking spray. (For easier clean-up, try lining pan with foil.) Bake 35 to 40 minutes or until chicken is cooked through and potatoes are tender, turning potatoes occasionally. Makes 6 Servings.

# **Brookies** (Fudge Brownie with Pumpkin Chocolate Chip Cookie inside)

# **Ingredients**

2 C. flour 1/2 c. sugar

1 tsp. baking soda 1/2 C. brown sugar

1/2 tsp. baking powder 1 egg

1/2 tsp. salt2/3 C. pumpkin puree1 tsp. cinnamon1 tsp. vanilla extract3/4 tsp. nutmeg1 C. chocolate chips1/2 C. butter, softened1 box brownie mix

#### **Instructions**

- Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Grease a 12-cup muffin tin with cooking spray. Prepare brownie batter according to box instructions. Set aside.
- Whisk together flour, salt, baking soda, baking powder cinnamon and nutmeg in a medium bowl until evenly combined. In a separate large bowl, combine butter and sugars. Beat until light and fluffy. Add egg, pumpkin and vanilla and mix until evenly combined. Gradually, add the dry ingredients and mix until just combined. Fold in chocolate chips.
- Divide brownie batter between the muffin cups. Each cup should be filled halfway to two-thirds of the way up. Scoop rounded tablespoons of cookie dough and roll them into balls. Place the cookie dough balls into the centers of a each brownie batter-filled cup. Bake for 15-20 minutes, until a toothpick inserted into the brownie cup comes out with a few moist crumbs. (Use any extra cookie dough to bake pumpkin chocolate chip cookies!)
- Let cool in muffin tin for about 10 minutes, then transfer brookies to a cooling rack. Serve warm or at room temperature. Serves 12.
