The Pastor's Page August - September 2023

I had somewhat of a hard time trying to decide what to write about for this newsletter. I thought about writing about the polarizing political climate, especially with hearing more and more about the 2024 presidential election; I thought about writing about how we are coming into the time of year where our routines and schedules become more 'normal' and I even thought about writing about Christian Nationalism (which, when I looked back at previous newsletter articles, I see that I did this last year at this time). I even thought about

writing about change and how changes occur whether or not we want them to happen, whether or not we acknowledge them and the implications of change in our lives. Having started several different drafts centering on these different themes, I still didn't feel comfortable with any one of them.

Not being able to settle on one theme and write something coherent and cohesive on it, I took a step back and thought about the constants in our lives. The only thing that really remains constant – the only thing that can remain constant – is something that was not created, something that was not made. For Christians, that constant is God and God's love for the creation and God's desire to bring this creation back onto the vision which God had at the beginning. That vision is one where everything lives according to its purpose, a purpose which is given by God.

Recognizing that humanity has fallen away from God and tried to blaze and control our own path through history, God's desire still had not changed. God's desire was then to redeem humanity without having to throw it all away and start anew. Sending God's Son to make that redeeming act was the only way possible for humanity, as created by God, to be made right with God again. The Bible tells us the story of God's attempts at getting humanity to turn back to God and humanity's resistance to doing that.

Over the centuries since Jesus' redeeming act, as chronicled in the Gospels, this Good News of Jesus has been co-opted, twisted and changed to be used for people's selfish desires. Many people have looked at these misuses of the Gospels to 'prove' how wrong religion, in general, is; and how 'bad' Christianity is in particular and how wrong it is to misplace our trust something so evil. Some of these misuses of the Gospel has been to justify colonialism and wiping out indigenous peoples; to believe in the superiority of one group of people over others; applying the message of the Gospel to certain groups of people, excluding others who are not like them; and to use the earth's resources however we want, without regards to anything else; to name just a few.

What we need to do is to get back to the Gospel message of Jesus, how the redeeming act of Jesus is meant by God to be for all people, everywhere, at the exclusion of no one. This will require us to take a look at what we do and say and see how consistent we are with the Gospels, not try to make the Gospels fit what we want them to say in order to justify our actions. We need to listen to the words of the Lord's Prayer and accept them as a prayer of submission on our part to allow God be God and do what is best for us, not telling God what we want God to do.

While we do need to acknowledge the misuse of the Gospels in the past, we also need to keep proclaiming this Good News and in doing so, we will find a way through the forgiveness of sins past all the wrongs that have been done. Not an easy process, but one that needs to be done.

Recipes From Penny's Kitchen

Garlic & Herb Slow Cooker Pork Roast

Prep Time 5 minutes minutes, Cook Time 9 hours, Servings 6 servings

Ingredients

3 pound pork roast butt or shoulder (not pork loin)

1 teaspoon salt 1 C chicken broth (or beef, pork or vegetable

broth)

1/2 teaspoon pepper4 cloves garlic minced1/2 teaspoon paprika1 teaspoon dried thyme1 large onion thick sliced1 teaspoon dried rosemary

Instructions

Season your pork roast on all sides with salt, pepper, and paprika. Set aside. Add onions and chicken broth to the bottom of a 6 quart slow cooker. Add seasoned pork roast on top. Sprinkle top of roast with garlic, thyme, and rosemary. Cover and cook on low heat for 9-10 hours, or until roast is fall-apart tender. A larger roast will take longer to cook. Or, cook your roast on high heat for 5-6 hours. Shred roast with a fork, removing any remaining fatty pieces before serving. Serve over mashed potatoes, or on a sandwich. Leftovers reheat well - store leftover meat with some of the liquid from the bottom of the slow cooker to keep moist.

Swirled Cheesecake Nibbles

Ingredients

36 vanilla wafers

1 2/3 cup package nestle swirl real semi sweet choc and white choc morsel

2 pkgs cream cheese softened

1/2 cup granulated sugar

2 tbsp flour

2 large eggs

Tsp vanilla extract

Directions

Preheat oven to 350; place 36 baking cups on cookies sheet; 1 vanilla wafer (flat side down) in each cup; 5-6 morsels on each wafer; beat cream cheese, sugar and flour in large mixing bowl until creamy; add eggs and vanilla extract, beat well; spoon heaping tbsp mixture into each cup; bake for 15-17 minutes or just until set (not browned); remove from oven to wire rack; while still warm top cheesecakes with remaining morsels; morsels will soften but will retain shape; cool completely; cover and refrigerate. Makes 3 dozen.
