# The Pastor's Page April / May 2024



One of my favorite texts about Easter is the story of the disciples who were traveling on the road to Emmaus that first Easter evening. The risen Jesus met them while they were walking to the town and began conversing with them. They told Him what was weighing heavy on their hearts and Jesus then took the time to explain to them everything that happened needed to happen. It was when they ate together once they reached Emmaus when they recognized Jesus through the breaking of the bread. The part to which I am especially drawn in this story is how

Jesus reacted to the disciples not recognizing what had happened over the last three days. Most times, this reaction by Jesus is described as meeting the disciples where they are, meeting them not only in their grief but also their lack of understanding and faith in the Scriptures. Another way of describing this is that Jesus had respect for their feelings and belief.

Over the last few weeks, I have had some conversations with different people, and it was interesting that the subject of respect arose. It wasn't that I brought it up first, but within the course of the conversations, it was noted how there seems to be a lack of respect across all aspects of society. There is a lack of respect for all types of authority. I am not saying that we should just blindly follow those in authority, but we can still be respectful in the ways in which we question those in authority. We do not need to resort to name calling or ridicule the physical features of those who disagree with us, but we can push them on the underlying assumptions that form their opinions.

A few generations ago, there was a certain level of respect that was quite formal. Since the 1960's, society has set aside the formalities of proper address to people and using the titles which they had earned. We wanted to have a more friendly society, where barriers and pedestals were eliminated, and we could talk to each other as equals. However, this went too far in that the respect that a person should have been afforded has been replaced with people trying to establish their own credentials as being superior to others. People are more interested in furthering their own brand, many times at the expense of others.

In the coming weeks and months, we will be hearing more and more campaigning from candidates for many elected offices. When we listen to them, do we hear a discussion of the issues, or do we hear smears about the opposing candidate? I do realize that this kind of campaigning has been going on for many years, but that doesn't make it right and doesn't mean that we should put up with it. We can demand that campaigns are run on the issues and how the candidates will solve the myriad of problems that face our democracy.

I will not endorse any public candidate for any office, nor will I tell anyone how they should vote. I believe that people are intelligent enough to weigh the positions on the issues and decide for themselves. We do need to remember, that as Christians, we have the example of Jesus and the rest of Scripture in which to measure a candidate's qualifications. We should not compromise our beliefs because a certain candidate agrees with us on one issue. We need to look at all the important issues before we make a decision.

Respect goes beyond elections and candidates. We should have respect for all whom we meet during the day, regardless of any physical trait that the person exhibits. Exhibits of road rage show a lack of respect. Not listening while someone else is talking by continual interruptions shows a lack of respect. Insisting that things are done only the way we want them to be shows a lack of respect. There are many, many more examples of where there is a lack of respect within all aspects of society. We can change that the way that Jesus had spread His Gospel message – to one person at a time with respect, compassion, and empathy. May we be bold enough to walk this path with others.

# **From Penny's Kitchen**

# **Garlic Brown Sugar Chicken Thighs**

# **Ingredients:**

8 bone-in, skin-on chicken thighs

salt and ground black pepper, to taste 1 tblsp honey

3 tablespoons unsalted butter, divided ½ tsp dried oregano 4 cloves garlic, minced ¼ tsp dried thyme ¼ cup packed brown sugar ¼ tsp dried basil

#### Directions:

Preheat the oven to 400 degrees F. Season chicken thighs with salt and pepper. Melt 2 tablespoons butter in a large ovenproof skillet over medium-high heat. Add chicken, skin-side down, and sear until brown, 2 to 3 minutes per side. Remove chicken to a plate. Melt remaining butter in the skillet. Add garlic; cook and stir until fragrant. Remove from heat and stir in brown sugar, honey, oregano, thyme, and basil until well combined. Return chicken to the skillet. Bake in the preheated oven until chicken is no longer pink at the bone and the juices are clear (25 to 30 minutes). Thermometer inserted near the bone should read 165 degrees F.

### Pot Roast with Horseradish

# **Ingredients:**

1 tbsp salad oil 6 onions, sliced thin

1 boned rump roast 1 clove garlic, mashed w/2 tsp salt

2 tbsp flour 1 tsp pepper

1 jar (5 oz) horseradish ¼ cup white wine

## **Directions:**

Preheat oven to 325 degrees F. Brown meat on all sides in oil in a heavy pan; remove from pan. Sauté onions in remaining oil; sprinkle with flour. Add remaining ingredients, mix well. Place meat in the mixture; cover and cook about 1-1/2 hours or until tender. Makes 8 servings.
